



Roger Lamb

Who was Roger Lamb? Much of what we know about Camp Security was written by Roger Lamb. Sergeant Roger Lamb, a Welsh Fusilier, was a prisoner at Camp Security. After the war he wrote a book entitled **An Original And Authentic Journal Of Occurrences During The Late American War: From Its Commencement To The Year 1783**. Lamb relates his experiences as a British soldier, and part of those experiences take place at Camp Security. The book is a fascinating read. This book was originally published in 1809, is still being printed, and it is also available free online, since it is in the public domain in the United States.
