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

Alleghany County Va. Feb.

On this 16th day of Jan^y in the year
of our Lord, 1834, personally appeared before the Justices of Alleghany
County, in open Court (the said being a Court of Record) Adam
Quirkel, a resident of the said County of Alleghany and
State aforesaid aged about 77 years old, who was born
in the year 1755. & who being first duly sworn according
to Law, doth on his oath make the following declaration
in order to obtain the benefit of the Act of Congress passed
June 7th 1832; That he was born in the County of York, in
the State of Pennsylvania, and that he was drafted in the
Company Commanded by Thomas Manawick or Kanawha as
his Captain, and Marched to the City of New York, in the Month
of October 1778, when he joined the main Army, under the
Command of said Gen. Washington, & was shortly after as
a Lieutenant in the Company, to which this Applicant was
attached (the name of the other Officers and Regiment, we now
recollect) during this Applicants first tour of duty he served
the full term of two Months; when he was discharged and
returned home to the said County of York; where he
remained about twelve Months, when he was again drafted
in the Company Commanded by Capt. Coston (his given name
not now recollect) and was Marched to the City of Philadelphia
when he joined the Army, and was subsequently at and
engaged in the Battle of Brandy wine, where Gen. Washington
was in Command (this Applicant owing to the lapse of time
and loss of Memory, cannot now recollect the name of the
other Officers in Command, or the Regiment to which he was
attached) This Applicant in this his second tour of duty served
the full of two Months; This Applicant was permitted to re-
-turn at home, about two years after his return from his second
tour of duty, when he was again drafted in the fall of
the year 1781. and Marched in the Company Commanded by
Capt. Henry Morde, to the Town of Little York, to guard the
soldiers taken from Cornwallis, which had been stationed a

that place, during the applicants three Year of War, he served
the further Term of Two Months, when he was again discharged
and returned to his home, where he resided until the year 1800
and then moved to the County of ~~Rockingham~~ Rockingham Va
where he resided for a short time, and then moved into the
County of Pendleton, where he resided for about six years, then
he moved to the County of Botetourt, where he resided until
the decision of said, and has ever since lived in the County of
Allegheny; This Applicant is far advanced in life and living at
a great distance from the place of his nativity, knows of no
person by whom he can prove the above services, This applicant
has no documentary evidence of his services, having long since
given out all hopes of ever being remembered by his Country
This applicant refers the Department to Stephen Hook Esq and
Alexander Blair; And he hereby relinquishes every Claim to a
pension or annuity except the percent, and declares that his
name is not on the Army or Pension Roll of any State
known to and searched the day and year aforesaid. -

and that we concur in that opinion and belief. Sworn and

and that their statements are entitled to full Credit; And
the said Court do further Certify, that there is no regular
ordained Minister of the Gospel living in the neighborhood
of the said Applicant for a pension. -
