On this the ~~thirtieth~~ ^{twenty} day of August personally appeared in Open Court William Black of said County who being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration in the name of and as one of the children of Simeon Black deceased late of said County in order to obtain the benefit of the provisions of the act of Congress passed July 4. 1836. That the said Sarah Black at the time of her death in 1842 was about eighty three years of age - that she was the widow of Captain Adams Black who during the Revolutionary war was an Ensign in the Militia of York County Pennsylvania and to the best of his knowledge and belief served a tour sometime in the year 1776 in that capacity from York County of Pennsylvania towards Albany in the State of New Jersey

He further declares that after he performed that tour he was appointed a Captain and served in that capacity, but how long or how often he does not know - that he was engaged as a Captain somewhere towards Philadelphia, and the Delaware River and likewise towards the close of the war was engaged in guarding prisoners who were taken from the British, that he cannot give a full narrative of the services of the said Adams Black, but that the accompanying papers which have always been in the possession of his father's family may show

a part thereof. He further declares that the
said Sarah Black was married to the said
Eldon Black about the year 1774. he can
not give the exact day or month.

That her husband the said Adam, died
about the 16th July 1816 and that the said
Sarah Black died (on or about the 9th
day of June 1842 and left the following
children Sarah intermarried with Samuel
Pop, and James Black both living in Franklin
County Pennsylvania Elizabeth intermarried with
Matthew Black residing in Chester County Penna
burgh, Jane, William, and Mary Black re-
siding in Adams County Pennsylvania.

He further declares that the said Sarah
Black remained the widow of said Adam
Black after his decease until her death.
