and twenty five Days; who being first duly sworn, according to law, doth
on her oath, make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit
of the provision made by the act of Congress, passed July 7, 1838, en-
titled "an act granting half pay and pensions to certain widows;" That
she is the widow of John Adam Schlett, who was a private in the Mil-
itia, during the Revolutionary War; That her husband the said John Adam
Schlett, was a pensioner of the United States, under the act of Congress of
7 June, 1832. Reference being had, to the proof on file in the pension office
of the United States, his services will fully and at large appear. She
further declares that she was married to the said John Adam Schlett,
on the twenty ninth Day of April, ^{in the year} Seventeen hundred, and Eighty-Eight.
That her husband, the aforesaid John Adam Schlett, died on the third
Day of August, in the year Eighteen hundred and thirty three; That she
was not married to him prior to his leaving the service, but the mar-
riage took place previous to the first of January, seventeen hundred and
ninety-four, viz: at the time above stated.

on April 29, 1788 to Catharina Holderrien.

Elisabeda Schlott, born March 3, 1791, under the sign of (illegible).



Be this eighth day of January in the
year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred
and thirty two personally appeared in open Court
before the Judges of the County of Common Pleas
of York County in the State of Pennsylvania now
before me Adam Schlott a resident of Windron Township
York County in the County of York and State of
Pennsylvania aged nearly one year, who being
well known to me reciting to me doth on his m-
lition make and declare the following declaration
in order to obtain the benefit of the Act of
Congress made recently of June twenty
second in the year of our Lord eighteen
hundred and thirty two. That I the said Adam Schlott
was born in Hesse Cassell in Germany on
the twenty six day of December one thou-
sand seven hundred and six thousand
I have a record of my age now in my
possession, recorded in the family Bible
which formerly belonged to my father
I was called into the service in the month
of August in the year one thousand
seven hundred and forty four
and was then living
in the County of Berks in the State of Pennsyl-
vania, since the Revolutionary war I have
lived in Windron Township York County
and State of Pennsylvania. I have lived
thus since the year one thousand seven hundred

and and Eighty eight-and continued to
live there.

I just entered the service as a substitute for
John Bucher of Reading, in Bucks County Pennsyl-
vania in the month of August in the year
one thousand seven hundred and seventy
six. I belonged to the Pennsylvania Line of
Militia, was attached to the ~~Regiment~~ Regi-
ment commanded by Colonel Dickenden
and in the company of Captain John
Golden. After leaving Reading we marched to
South Amboy in Jersey - I remained there one
month. At the expiration of that time I enlisted
in the flying camp. in the Company coman-
ded by Captain Jacob Powers. John Hollis
was the colonel of the Regiment. Gen Tom
Dwight was the General who commanded
in the corps the North River. - I was in
the Battle of White Plains. after the battle we
marched the Delaware at Trenton, to the
City of Pennsylvania and was discharged.
Served one month in the Pennsylvania
line of Militia and six months in the
flying camp. - Received a discharge
in writing but it has been lost for
many years.

I can only recollect a few who served

with me, my memory is bad and my recollection
indistinctly bad. I recollect that Valentine, command called
Billy Foster, last name I can't recollect, and
Henry Black were of the same company with my
self.

To Rude John George Schmitz, of the Borough
of York and a ^{Freeman} citizen of the ^{State} of New
York and Peter Reiter, ^{and his wife} son help to my character
and veracity - And as good behaviour -

I do not know any one now living who can
testify to my services. I enlisted in Reading and
have not been there since. and in consequence
of my infirmities and old age am unable
to travel so far to procure testimony of any such
could be had.

of his, written to a friend or enemy except the
present and with great desire that my name is
not on the Foreign Roll of any agency of any

Person to and I submitted the day and year

of York and a cobbler and the ^{Freeman} citizen

well acquainted with Adam Schleit who has

of age, that he is reputed and believed in the
neighbourhood where he resides to be a member
of the Revolution and that we incur in that opin-
ion.

Dear Madam:

Reference is made to your letter in which you
request the Revolutionary War record of Adam Schlett
of York County, in 1833 a pensioner.

The Revolutionary War record of John (Johan)
Adam Schlett which follows was obtained from the
papers on file in pension claim, W. 2870, based upon
his service in that war.

John Adam Schlett was born December 26, 1761 in
"Hessische Casselle", Middelsie, District of Schwartzfeld,
Germany; the names of his parents are not given.

While residing in Berks County, Pennsylvania, he
enlisted sometime in August, 1776, served one month as
private in Captain John Golden's company under Colonel
Dickender in the Pennsylvania troops; he immediately
enlisted in the Flying Camp and served six months in
Captain Jacob Bower's company, Colonel Haller's regiment
and was in the battle of White Plains.

He was allowed pension on his application ex-
ecuted, January 8, 1833, then a resident of Windsor Town-
ship, York County, Pennsylvania, where he had moved in
1788, from Berks County. He died August 3, 1833.

John Adam Schlett married April 29, 1789, Catharina
Holderriem. It is not shown where they married; the date
and place of her birth are not given, nor are the names

initialled before sending out -

of her parents stated.

The soldier's widow, Catherine Schlett, was allowed pension on her application executed, June 17, 1829, then aged seventy-two years, eight months and twenty-five days, and living in Windsor Township, York County, Pennsylvania.



