On this eighth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty three personally appeared in open Court before the Judges of the County of York and Seat of York County in the State of Pennsylvania named Adam Schlott, a resident of Windsor Township in the County of York and State of Pennsylvania aged twenty one year, who being duly sworn according to law took in his solemn oath to make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the Act of Congress passed recently of June thirtieth A.D. 1832. That I the said Adam Schlott was born in Hildes Copell in Germany on the twenty sixth day of December one thousand seven hundred and thirty one - I have a recollection of my age now in my possession, read in the family bible which formerly belonged to my father and I was called into the service in the month of August in the year one thousand seven hundred and thirty four in the County of Berks in the State of Pennsylvania since the Revolutionary war I have lived in Windsor Township York County and State of Pennsylvania. I have lived there since the year one thousand seven hundred

died and forty eight and continued to live thro.

I first entered the service as a substitute for
Capt. Buckner of Reading, in Bucks County Pennsylv
vania in the month of August in the year
1776. I served in the Pennsylvania line of
Militia, was attached to the ~~Regiment~~ Regi-
ment commanded by Colonel Dickinson
and in the company of Captain John
Golden. After leaving Reading we marched to
South Amboy in Jersey - I remained there one
month. At the expiration of that time I settled
in the flying camp in the company comman-
ded by Captain Isaac Stowers. Peter Heller
was the Colonel of the Regiment. Gen. James
Mifflin was the General who commanded.
We then crossed the North River. - I was in
the Battle of Red Bank. After the battle we
retreated to the Delaware at Trenton, to the
State of Pennsylvania and was discharged.
I served one month in the Pennsylvania
line of Militia and six months in the
flying camp. - I received a discharge
in writing but it has been lost for
many years.

I can only recollect a few who served

with me, my memory is bad and my recollection
is distinctly bad. I recollect that Valentine's company called
Capt. Gordon, Capt. Barrow, Commodore Parker, and
Henry Kluck were of the same company with my-
self.

The Purse John George Schmucker of the Borough
of York and Peter Heller ^{and also John Thomas Esq. of the Borough} can testify to my character
and veracity - ~~fact~~ and to good behavior -

I do not know any one now living who can
testify to my services. I resided in Reading and
have not been there since. and in consequence
of my infirmities can do older age am unable
to live so far to procure testimony - if any such
could be had.

I Adam ~~Shelton~~ ^{Shelton} hereby relinquish every
claim, whether to a pension or annuity except the
present and doth hereby declare that my name is
not on the Pension Roll of any agency of any of the
States -

Reference is made to your letter in which you
request the Revolutionary War record of Adam Schlott
of York County, in 1833 a pensioner.

The Revolutionary War record of John (Johan)
Adam Schlott which follows was obtained from the
papers on file in pension claim, W. 2870, based upon
his service in that war.

John Adam Schlott was born December 26, 1761 in
Hesse Casselle, Middelzie, District of Schwartzfeld,
Germany; the names of his parents are not given.

While residing in Berks County, Pennsylvania, he
enlisted sometime in August, 1776, served one month as
private in Captain John Golden's company under Colonel
Dickender in the Pennsylvania troops; he immediately
enlisted in the Flying Camp and served six months in
Captain Jacob Bower's company, Colonel Haller's regiment
and was in the battle of White Plains.

He was allowed pension on his application exe-
cuted, January 8, 1833, then a resident of Windsor town-
ship, York County, Pennsylvania, where he had moved in
1786, from Berks County. He died August 3, 1833.

John Adam Schlott married April 29, 1788, Catharina
Holderrism. It is not shown where they married; the date
and place of her birth are not given, nor are the names

changed before sending out -

of her parents stated.

The soldier's widow, Catharina Schlett, was allowed pension on her application executed, June 17, 1838, then aged seventy-two years, eight months and twenty-five days, and living in Windsor Township, York County, Pennsylvania.
