Personally appeared before me the Subscriber one of
the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas in &
For said County Bathurst Wicks a resident of said
County of York Pa aged Sixty seven years who
being first duly sworn according to Law doth in
his oath make the following declaration in order
to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the
Act of Congress passed July 7th 1838 Entitled an
Act granting half pay and pensions to certain
widows That she is the Widow of Daniel
Wicks who was a private in Captain Copperhavers
Company & Col Swopes Battalion And
that he enlisted in said Corps in York
County Pa about the first July 1776 for six
months and duly served out the time for
which he was enlisted as she understood
from him
2 That he was drafted in the year 1781 to
be Capt. White Comd^t and marched to a
place called Camp Security to guard
watch & keep safe the British prisoners
taken with Gen^l Cornwallis as he stated
who were stationed at in York County
for keeping safe as prisoners of War and duly
served out the time for which he was drafted
She further declares that she was married to him
the said Daniel Wicks in the month of October
1790 and that her said husband Daniel Wicks
died May 31st 1833 and that she was not
married to him prior to his leaving the service

But the marriage took place previous to the
first of Jan^y 1794 at the time above stated
