Personally appeared before me the subscriber, president Judge of the Court of Common Pleas in and for said County of York Pa. Eve Rouchenour a resident of said County and State Aforesaid aged 77 years who being first duly sworn according to law in Open Court now sitting in said County Doth on her Bath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the Act of Congress passed July 7th 1838 and the Act of 3rd March 1843 and the Act of June 17th 1844 That she is the widow of Jacob Rouchenour a Soldier of the Revolution in the Pennsylvaⁿ Line that he Enlisted on or about the first of July 1776 in Capt Grays Company in Col. Reddons Reg^t for six months in the County of York Pa and marched to York and duly served seven months and that he served two months in the fall of the year 1781 and was drafted to serve in Capt Pennington Company at a place called Camp Security in the County of York to guard watch & keep secure the British prisoners duly served out the time for which he was drafted and that he served altogether nine months on the Army of the Revolution as he stated & the further States she was married to him on about the 1st of Sept^r in the year seventeen hundred and Eighty One (A.D.) and that her husband the aforesaid Jacob Rouchenour died in the 28th day of August 1834 and that she has remained a widow ever since his death, That she was not married prior to his leaving the service but the marriage took place previous to the first of January 1796 at the time above stated Seven to and Subscribed on the day and year above written Before me in Open Court Eve Rouchenour
