York September 10th 1782

In compliance with your Excellency's Orders of the 14th of last Month, I call'd one Class of Seven Battalions of the Militia of this County, and on the fifth instant the Company march'd from this Place for Fort Pitt. consisting of one Captain, one Lieutenant, one Ensign, three Serjents, and Seventy-eight Rank and File, all Arm'd and having about six round's of Ammunition, which was all we had, We were under the necessity of sending a Waggon to carry Provisions, as there was no Post beyond Carlisle where they could be supplied.

Wou'd wish to be inform'd, if they are to be relieved at the expiration of their two Months, by an other draft of the Militia of this County
