On this 22nd day of December 1855 one thousand eight hundred and fifty eight, personally appeared before me, a Justice of the peace within and for the County and State aforesaid, behndg; Sieglar, aged 21, single, then 22 years or less, a resident of the Borough of Hanover, in the State of Pennsylvania, who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that he is the identical Charles Sieglar, who was a private in the company commanded by Captain Jacob Behrman, that the number of the Regiment he does not remember, nor does he remember the name of the Colonel by whom it was commanded, that he ~~was~~ rendered the service during the war of the Revolution, that he was drafted at Hanover aforesaid, but can not now remember the day or year, only that he was drafted for the term of one month, to guard the English prisoners at Stony run in the County aforesaid, and continued in actual service in said war for the term of one month, and was honorably discharged at Wilmersburg at the expiration of said term.

He makes this declaration for the purpose of obtaining the bounty land to which he may be entitled under the act approved March 3, 1855. He also declares that he has not received a warrant for bounty land under this or any other act of Congress, nor made any other application therefor.
