On this seventh day of August 1820, personally appeared, in open court, Michael Shultz aged 63 years, resident in said county, who being first duly sworn, according to law, doth, on his solemn oath declare that he served in the Revolutionary war as follows: viz. In Col. Hartley's Regiment in Capt. Green's company in the Pennsylvania line from the month of January 1776 until the end of our year, that the date of his original application for a pension is in June 4th 1818 and the number of his pension certificate 17460.

And I do solemnly swear that I was a resident citizen of the United States, on the 18th day of March, 1818; and that I have not since that time, by gift, sale, or in any manner, disposed of my property, or any part thereof, with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of the act of congress, entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States, in the Revolutionary war," passed on the 18th day of March, 1818; and that I have not, nor has any person in trust for me, any property, or securities, contracts, or debts, due to me; nor have I any income other than what is contained in the schedule hereto annexed, and by me subscribed. viz. One hundred acres of barren land with a small cabin and stable thereon erected lying in York County state apportion value \$200. This land I have never paid for - one horse value \$10. or two cows \$12.00 four sheep \$2.50 - one sow and four pigs \$2.00 one old waggon \$4.00 one plough \$0.50 one cart \$1.00 one table \$0.50 - three chairs \$0.75 and a bunch of kitchen furniture \$4.00 my exception is that of a cabinet - I am not able to work much - my wife is a very poor woman one son and one daughter both of age now living with me my debts amount to \$560.00 I have no friends to whom to apply and declared, on the seventh day of August 1820 before George Bonney

law saith. That he is a resident citizen
of the ~~United States~~ State, aged about sixty
three years; that he is from his reduced
circumstances in life in need of as-
sistance from his country for support,
that he enlisted in York in Capt. Krings
Company (Mc Dowell, Mc Callister & Nicholas)
one of the subaltern officers of said Company
in Col. Hes. Hartley's Regiment of the
Pennsylvania Line; that he enlisted as
above in the month of January
in 1775 or 1776, he cannot now recollect
wholly, that he continued to serve
in said Regiment for the term of
about 14 months, he having enlisted
for one year only, that he was
discharged at Carlisle about 14 months
after he enlisted & that he lost his
right leg several years ago. & further
to swear that this deponent ^{has}

Dear Sir:

Reference is made to your letter in which you request the Revolutionary War record of Michael Schults, a pensioner of York County, Pennsylvania.

The data given herein are found in the papers on file in pension claim, S. 41142, based upon the service of Michael Schults in that war.

Michael Schults enlisted sometime in January 1776, in the "Borough of York", Pennsylvania, served one year as private in Captain David Grier's company, Colonel Thomas Hartley's Pennsylvania regiment and was discharged in Carlisle, Pennsylvania.

He was allowed pension on his application executed June 4, 1818, at which time he resided York County, Pennsylvania. The soldier was then aged about sixty-three years; the date and place of his birth and names of his parents are not shown.

In 1820, Michael Schults stated that his family consisted of his wife, a son and a daughter, both of age. He did not give the name of his wife, her age, nor the date and place of their marriage, nor the names of any children.

The soldier died February 8, 1834.
