York June 15<sup>th</sup> 1732

Sir

On Sunday last I received the Order of Council of the 23<sup>rd</sup> May; and agreeable to the directions therein contained. have ordered one half of the light Horse and four Companies of the militia of York County to hold themselves in readiness to march at the shortest notice.

I have also taken an account of the Publick Arms at this place and find  
Sixty eight musquets fit for service; &  
thirty eight unfit; which I have ordered to be immediately repaired. and the Gunsmiths inform me that they will be all finished in a few days.

I herewith send the Proceeding of a Court Marshal for the tryal of sundrie Officers of the Militia who were charged <sup>with</sup> divers offences. Requesting your Excellency's Opinion of said Proceeding. and if approved of
