On this seventh day of August 1820, personally appeared, in open court, Michael Schultz aged 63 years, resident in said county, who being first duly sworn, according to law, doth, on his solemn oath declare that he served in the Revolutionary war as follows: viz. In Col. Hartley's Regiment in Capt. Greer's company in the Pennsylvania line from the month of January 1776 until the end of our year, that the date of his original application for a pension is June 4th 1818 and the number of his pension certificate 17,460.

And I do solemnly swear that I was a resident citizen of the United States, on the 18th day of March, 1818; and that I have not since that time, by gift, sale, or in any manner, disposed of my property, or any part thereof, with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of the act of congress, entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States, in the Revolutionary war," passed on the 18th day of March, 1818; and that I have not, nor has any person in trust for me, any property, or securities, contracts, or debts, due to me; nor have I any income other than what is contained in the schedule hereto annexed, and by me subscribed. viz. One hundred acres of barren land with a small cabin and stable thereon erected by me in York County State of Pennsylvania value \$200, this land I have never paid for - one horse value \$10.00 two cows \$12.00 four sheep \$2.50 - one row and four pigs \$2.00 one old wagon \$4.00 one plough \$0.50 one sheat \$1.00 one table \$0.50 - three chairs \$0.75 and a few articles of kitchen furniture \$4.00 my occupation is that of a laborer - I am not able to work much - my wife is a sickly person - I have one son and one daughter both of age now living with me - my debts amount to \$50.00 - I have no funds to, and declared, on the seventh day of August 1820

If the judge is satisfied of the same or the contrary service of at least 4m. of the applicant it is necessary that his certificate in regard to that effect should be furnished to this office. Reference is made to your letter in which you request the
Revolutionary War record of Michael Schultz, a pensioner of York
County, Pennsylvania.

The data given herein are found in the papers on file in
pension claim, S. 41143, based upon the service of Michael Schultz
in that war.

Michael Schultz enlisted sometime in January 1776, in the
"Borough of York", Pennsylvania, served one year as private in
Captain David Orier's company, Colonel Thomas Hartley's Pennsylvania
regiment and was discharged in Carlisle, Pennsylvania.

He was allowed pension on his application executed June 4,
1818, at which time he resided York County, Pennsylvania. The
soldier was then aged about sixty-three years; the date and place
of his birth and names of his parents are not shown.

In 1820, Michael Schultz stated that his family consisted
of his wife, a son and a daughter, both of age. He did not give
the name of his wife, her age, nor the date and place of their marriage,
nor the names of any children.

The soldier died February 8, 1834.
