She further states that she was married to Mr. James William Moore in Lancaster County in the State of Pennsylvania - she does not remember the exact date - in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and four born by the Reverend James Gillis a minister of the Gospel and that her name before her marriage was Jane Stranahan that her late husband died in the Township of East Hanover in the County of Chester aforesaid in the thirty first day of April in the year of our

On the thirteenth day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty four personally appeared before the Court of Common Pleas of the County of Chester of the State of Pennsylvania, Jane Moore a resident of the Township of Wallace in the County of Chester and State aforesaid aged seventy four years, who first being duly affirmed according to law, doth on her affirmation make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefits of the provisions made by the act of Congress, passed on the 3^d day of February A.D. 1853, granting pensions to widows of persons who served during the revolutionary war; That she is the widow of William Moore who was a private and Sergeant in the Revolutionary war, that she is unable to state the particulars of his service, which however she presumes is unexceptionable as the said William Moore during his life time having performed his service received a pension from the United States under the act of Congress of Jan 7th 1813 & 32 which was paid him at the age of receiving pensions at Philadelphia in the State of Pennsylvania, the original certificate for which dated Aug 1st 1813 is hereto appended.

The further declares that she was married to the said William Moore sometime in the month of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fourty two, she does not remember the day of the month she never received any certificate of her marriage;

That her said husband died on the thirty first day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty two, that she was not married to him prior to the second of January, eighteen hundred, but at the time above stated. She further declares that she is now a widow.

On comparing these papers with the following rules and the subjacent notes you will readily perceive that objections exist, which must be removed, before a pension can be allowed. The notes and the regulations will shew what is necessary to be done. Those points to which your attention is more particularly directed, you will find marked in the margin with a brace, (thus { }). You will, when you return your papers to this Department, send this printed letter with them; and you will, by complying with this request, greatly facilitate the investigation of your claim.

On the eleventh day of June personally appeared in Open Court before the Hon. Isaac Darlington President Judge of the Court of Common Pleas of the County of Chester aforesaid, was sitting, William Moore a resident of Brandywine Township in the said County of Chester & State of Pennsylvania, aged seventy six years, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress passed June 7th 1832.

That he entered the service of the United States under the following named officers and served as herein stated to wit:

1st That your declarant was, after harvest, in the year 1776, drafted as a militiaman of the first Company of Pennsylvania Militia, to serve for two months, in a company raised in Marticke Township, Lancaster County, Penn^a and commanded by Captain Lancaster, the name of any of the other Company Officers he does not remember; that your declarant was at Porters Camp Roads in Lancaster Company, met at Porters Camp Roads in Marticke Township aforesaid, & marched from thence to Philadelphia where it joined its Regiment; that after staying at Philadelphia a short time, it moved through New Jersey to Amboy, from whence we could see the Hudson on the opposite shore of the river; the Hudson on the opposite shore of the river; that after living here a short time a requisition of a certain number of men was made upon such Company to serve in the flying Camps, that the quota of your declarants Company was made up immediately by volunteers, & that the remainder soon marched back to

Philadelphia where we were distributed having served our two months time, that your declarant was not in, nor interrupted any engagement during this time, but he remembers that whilst living at Amboy a member of a rifle Corps fired across the river at the Hessian which was returned by a shot from a pistol, which struck a frame house I don't know it done injury but killed no one, this being against orders the afternoon the fire was put under guard, that this is all your declarant can remember of his first town, he is unable to give the names of any of the officers of his Regiment.

2^d That in the Spring of 1777 your declarant was again drafted in the 1st Co. of Marticke Township in a company raised in Marticke Township you are (in which he was still a recruit) (the name of the Captain of which he cannot remember but remembers that he was taken sick soon after the commencement of the town & remained lame,) the house of the first Lieutenant was Robert Miller and of the second Peter Simpson, and your declarant was during this time Captain by Sergeant of his Company; that the Company marched to Lancaster, where we were employed during the two months for which we were drafted, in standing guard over the Hessian prisoners who had been removed there, & also over the magazine at that place; that there were several other Companies beside your declarants the horses at the same place but cannot remember the officer who had the command of the while or any of the officers of those companies, that after the expiration of the two months we were permitted to return. This is all your declarant can remember of his second town.

3^d That in the fall of 1777 your declarant went as a substitute for his father, Sam More, to perform a term of duty of two months, in he thinks, the 3^d Regt of Penn Militia, in a Company raised in Lancaster County (of which your declarant was still under,) which your declarant was still under,) commanded by Captain Wilson, & of which your declarant was appointed & acted as orderly sergeant during the term. Cannot remember the names of either of the Battalions, that the Company appeared at Pott's Creek Roads in Lancaster County, & marched from thence to White Marsh, where we joined our Regiment of the American Army, that when we arrived the British Army was encamped on Chestnut Hill. Your declarant cannot remember the name of his regimental Officer, but thinks Patrick Marshall was a Captain in his Regiment & was killed in a skirmish, in which Genl. Gage (who had command of the British) was wounded & taken prisoner; that your declarant was sick during part of this term with the pleurisy, during which time he was taken out of camp to a house about a mile & a half towards Birsby town, that when the two months had expired some of your declarant's Company who had attended him informed his father of his discharge, who immediately came after him & took him home, that your declarant during this time was engaged in none of the skirmishes, there are the details of your declarant this time so far as he can remember them.

4th That your declarant was again drafted in the 1st Regt of Penna Militia, cannot remember the year, but remembers that it was in the fall of the year, that they made her can be remember any of the officers of the Company or Regiment except the Colonel whose name was Hoolley, that he was drafted for two months & appears in a Company raised in Lancaster County & was appointed & acted as orderly sergeant during the time; he thinks the regiment rendezvoused at Lancaster & thence marched north for the purpose of attacking the Indians at Bosley's Mills, passing through Newbury & then offering the river to Northam he land & then marched about nine miles north by to Bosley's Mills & Fort, but the Indians, whom it was said were British, learning of our approach had fled, that the regiment remained at Bosley's Fort until the expiration of the two months for which they were drafted and during part of their stay your declarant with twelve men, guarded Engine Heater's house which was about 5 miles from the fort, that Scouting parties were frequently out but the Indians having moved north upon an approach did not again infest that neighborhood. These are the particulars of your declarants fourth & last tour so far as he can remember the same.

To the interrogatories propounded by the Court your declarant answers as follows to wit,

To the 1st That he was born in Mifflin
Township Lancaster County Pennsylvania
on the thirty first day of October A.D. 1800 one
thousand seven hundred and fifty seven

To the 2nd That he has a record of his age
in a Bynum Book which is in his possession
which was made from a Master-Sworn Bill
of the County made in his father's Bills
which was then lost in his memory, that
his father's Bill was taken by a brother
who removed to Maryland & is now
deceased & your declarant is unable to
tell what has become of the Bill.

To the 3rd That he was living in Mifflin
Township Lancaster County Penna when called
into service during the several times herein
stated & that soon after the revolution
he removed from that Township, to Peachy
Run Township Chester County Penna, where
he has resided ever since.

To the 4th That he was always always
enlisted except the 3rd time when he was
a Substitute for his father as is herein
stated

To the 5th That of the Regular Officers who
were with the Troops where he served he
remembers Capt John Marshall Joseph Penny
his 1st Lieutenant & John Steele his 2nd Lieut
all of the Penna Line & lived near your
declarant and also Asst Adj'tl Steele who
was at Quebec with Montgomery & had three
of his fingers shot off - he does not remember
whether he was a Captain or a Lieutenant;
that he is unable to give the names of any
others, neither is he able to give the names of
any Continentals or British Regiments & as to

the general circumstances of his service they
are as fully related in the body of the decla-
ration as his memory will permit

To the 6th That he never received a dis-
charge from the Service but was discharged
& returned home as soon as the time for
which he was drafted had expired.

To the 7th That he is well known to
Capt Nathan Stanley & Capt James Cochran
who reside in my present neighborhood and
who can testify as to my character for honesty
and belief of my services as a Soldier of
the Revolution.

Your declarant further states that he
is unable to state many of the circumstan-
ces of his service because of the great failure
of his memory from age I declare
which has take place within two years
past, prior to which he can let detail many
minute circumstances which have now
no place in his recollection. That he knows of no
way through which he can get a knowledge of his losses.

He hereby relinquishes every claim
whatever to a pension or annuity except the
present and declares that his name is not
on the pension roll of the Agency of any
State.
