is the widow of William Moore deceased  
who was a private and Sergeant in the  
Revolutionary War and for the part aforesaid  
and in favor of whose pension in said  
War she applies to the application of the  
said William Moore for a pension which  
was granted him, under the act of Congress  
of June 30, 1838 which is on file in the proper  
Department of the government at Washington  
D.C.

She further states that she was married  
to W. Jane William Moore in Lancaster  
County in the State of Pennsylvania in the month  
of January - she does not remember the exact  
date - in the year of Our Lord one thousand  
eight hundred and forty seven by the Reverend  
James Galbraith a minister of the Gospel and  
that her name before said marriage was  
Jane Wilson, that her said husband  
died in the Township of East Brandywine  
in the County of Chester aforesaid on the thirty  
first day of July in the year of Our Lord



Said on Monday eight hundred and  
forty two, and that there is now a widow;  
And for further evidence of her marriage  
with the said Nathaniel Moore and his death  
She refers to her application, as her widow,  
for a pension, which was granted her under  
the act of Congress of February 3<sup>d</sup> 1853,

I certify that, in conformity with the law of the United States  
of the 7th June, 1832, *William Moore*  
of the State of *Pennsylvania*  
who was a *Private Sergeant* in the Revolutionary war  
is entitled to receive *Thirty Six* dollars and  
*Thirty Six* cents per annum, during his natural life, commencing on  
the 4th of March, 1831, and payable semi-annually on the 4th of March, and  
4th of September, in every year.

in order to obtain the benefits of the provisions  
made by the act of Congress, passed on the  
3<sup>d</sup> day of February, A.D. 1853, granting pensions  
to widows of persons who served during  
the revolutionary war; That she is the  
widow of William Moore who was a  
private and Sergeant in the Revolutionary  
war, that she is unable to state the  
particulars of his service, what however she  
presumes is unnecessary inasmuch as the said  
William Moore during his life time having  
performed his service received a pension from  
the United States under the act of Congress  
of Jan 7<sup>th</sup> 1832 which was paid him at  
the age of for paying pensions at Phila-  
delphia in the State of said and the original  
certificate for which dated August 10 1813  
is hereto appended

The further declares that she was married  
to the said William Moore sometime in the  
month of January in the year of our Lord one  
thousand eight hundred and fourteen, she  
does not remember the day of the month, & never  
received any certificate of her marriage;  
That her said husband died on the thirty  
first day of July in the year of our Lord  
one thousand eight hundred and fifty two,  
that she was not married to him prior to  
the second of January, eighteen hundred,  
but at the time above stated. She further  
declares that she is now a widow.

The evidence in support of your claim, under the act of June 7, 1832, has been examined, and the papers are herewith returned. The following is a statement of your case in a tabular form. On comparing these papers with the following rules, and the subjoined notes you will readily perceive that objections exist, which must be removed, before a pension can be allowed. The notes and the regulations will show what is necessary to be done. These points to which your attention is more particularly directed, you will find marked in the margin with a brace, (thus. { ). You will, when you return your papers to this Department, send this printed letter with them; and you will, by complying with this request, greatly facilitate the investigation of your claim.

On this eleventh day of June personally appeared in Open Court, before the Hon. Judge Darlington President Judge of the Court of Common Pleas of the County of Chester aforesaid, now sitting, William Moore a Resident of Brandywine Township in the said County of Chester & State of Pennsylvania, aged seventy six years, who being first duly sworn according to law, with an oath that he will make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress [passed March] 1832.

That he entered the service of the United States under the following named officers and served as herein stated, to wit:

1<sup>st</sup> Your declarant was, after harvest, in the year 1776, drafted as a militia man of the first Class of Pennsylvania Militia, to serve for two months, in a company raised in Marlborough Township Lancaster County, Penn<sup>a</sup> and commanded by a Captain as he thinks, tho' he is not positive, by a Captain Watson; the names of any of the other Company Officers he does not remember; - that your declarant's company met at Porter's Cross Roads in Lancaster County, & marched from Marlborough Township aforesaid, & marched from thence to Philadelphia where it joined its brethren to the Hessian Regiment; - that after laying at Philadelphia a short time, it moved <sup>thence</sup> to Amboy, from whence we could see Jersey to Amboy, from whence we could see the Hessians on the opposite shore of the river; that after lying here a short time a requisition of a certain number of men was made upon each company to serve in the flying Camp; that the quota of your declarant's company was made up immediately by volunteers & that the remainder soon marched back to

Philadelphia where we were dismissed having served two months time, that your declarant was not in, nor witnessed any engagement during this time, but he remembers that whilst lying at Amboy a number of a Rifle Corps fired across the river at the Hessians which was returned by a shot from a Squirrel, which struck a frame house & done it some injury, but killed no one, this being against order, the officer who fired was put under guard, that this is all your declarant can remember of his first term; - he is unable to give the names of any of the officers of his Regiment.

2<sup>d</sup> That in the Spring of 1777 your declarant was again drafted <sup>for the second time</sup> in the 1<sup>st</sup> Class of Penn<sup>a</sup> Militia in a company raised in Marlborough Township aforesaid (in which he was still a resident) the name of the Captain of which he cannot give, <sup>but</sup> ~~remembers~~ <sup>as</sup> he was taken sick soon after the commencement of the term & returned home, the name of the first Lieutenant was Robert Shuler and of the second Peter Simpson and your declarant was during this term Captain's Adjutant of his company; that the Company marched to Lancaster, where we were employed during the two months for which we were drafted, in standing guard whilst we were drafted, in standing guard over the Hessian Prisoners who had been removed there, & also over the magazine at that place; that there were several other Companies besides your declarant's stationed at the same place but cannot remember the names of the officers who had the command of the whole or any of the officers of these companies whilst after the expiration of the two months we were permitted to return. This is all your declarant can remember of his second term.



3<sup>d</sup> That in the fall of 1777 your declarant went as a substitute for his father, Adam Morse to perform a term of duty of two months, as he thinks, the 3<sup>d</sup> Class of Pennsylvania Militia in a company raised in Lancaster Township (of which your declarant was still resident) commanded by Captain Skisom, of which your declarant was appointed & acted as orderly sergeant during the term. Cannot remember the names of either of the Lieutenant. That the company assembled at Pater's Cross Roads in Lancaster County, & marched from thence to White Marsh, where we joined our Regiment & the American Army; that when we arrived the British Army was encamped on Chestnut Hill. Your declarant cannot remember the name of his Lieutenant Officer, but thinks Patrick Marshall was a Captain in his Regiment & was killed in a skirmish, in which Grahm (who had command of the Militia) was wounded & taken prisoner; that your declarant was sick during part of this term with the pleurisy, during which time he was taken out of camp to a nurse about a mile & an half towards Hickory town, that when the two months had expired some of your declarant's company who had returned home informed his father of his sickness who immediately came after him & took him home, that your declarant during this time was engaged in none of the skirmishes; there are the details of your declarant's time so far as he can remember them.

4<sup>th</sup> That your declarant was again drafted in the 1<sup>st</sup> Class of Pennsylvania Militia cannot remember the year, but remembers that it was in the fall of the year, that they marched, he can remember any of the officers of the Company a Lieutenant except the Colonel whose name was Hootley; that he was drafted for two months & again in a company raised in Lancaster Township in a company appointed & acted as orderly sergeant & was appointed & acted as orderly sergeant during the term; he thinks the Regiment encamped at Lancaster & thence marched north for the purpose of attacking the Indians at Bosley's Mills, passing through Turbony & then crossing the river to Northumberland & thence marched about nine miles north to Bosley's Mills & Fort, but the Indians, ~~when~~ whom it was said there were British, hearing of our approach had fled, that the Regiment remained at Bosley's Fort until the expiration of the two months for which they were drafted and during part of their stay your declarant with twelve men, guarded George Hewitt's house which was about 5 miles from the Fort. That scouting parties were frequently out but the Indians having moved north upon our approach did not again infect that neighborhood. These are the particulars of your declarant's fourth & last term so far as he can remember the same.

To the interrogatories propounded by the Court your declarant answers as follows to wit,

To the 1<sup>st</sup> That he was born in ~~identical~~  
Township Lancaster County Pennsylvania  
on the thirty first day of October A.D. one  
thousand seven hundred and fifty seven

To the 2<sup>nd</sup> That he has a record of his age  
in a Hymn Book, which is in his possession  
which was made from a ~~document~~  
off the ~~document~~ made in his father's Bible  
which was then fresh in his memory, that  
his father's Bible was taken by a brother  
who ~~removed~~ to Maryland & is now  
deceased & your declarant is unable to  
tell what has become of the Bible

To the 3<sup>rd</sup> That he was living in ~~identical~~  
Township Lancaster County Penna when called  
into service during the several times herein  
related & that soon after the revolution  
he removed from that Township, to Grand  
Tine Township Chester County, Penna, where  
he has resided ever since.

To the 4<sup>th</sup>. That he was always ~~always~~  
married except the 3<sup>rd</sup> year when he was  
a substitute for his father as is therein  
stated

To the 5<sup>th</sup>. That of the Regular officers who  
were with the Troop where he served he  
remembers Capt John Marshall Joseph Brown  
his 1<sup>st</sup> Lieut & John Steele his 2<sup>nd</sup> Lieut  
all of the Penna Line & lived near your  
declarant and also ~~abolish~~ Steele who  
was at Iuka with Montgomery & that these  
of his friends shot off - he does not remember  
whether he was a Captain or a Lieutenant &  
that he is unable to give the names of any  
others, neither is he able to give the names of  
any Continental or United States Regiments & as to

the general circumstances of his service they  
are as fully related in the body of the declara-  
tion as his memory will permit

To the 6<sup>th</sup> That he never received a dis-  
charge from the service but was ~~discharged~~  
& returned home as soon as the time for  
which he was drafted had expired.

To the 7<sup>th</sup> That he is well known to  
Capt Matthew Stanley & Capt James Lockhart  
who reside in my present neighborhood and  
who can testify as to my character for loyalty  
& true belief of my service as a Soldier of  
the revolution.

Your declarant further states that he  
is unable to state many of the circumstances  
of his service because of the great failure  
of his memory from age & disease  
which has taken place within two years  
past, prior to which he could detail many  
minute circumstances which have now  
no place in his recollection. That he knows of no  
person being able to testify to the nature of his service.  
He hereby relinquishes every claim

whenever to a pension or annuity except the  
present and declares that his name is not  
on the pension roll of the agency of any  
State.

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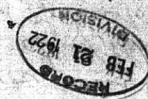

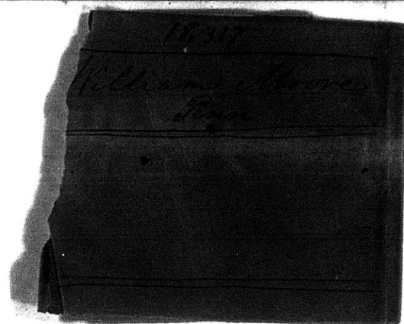
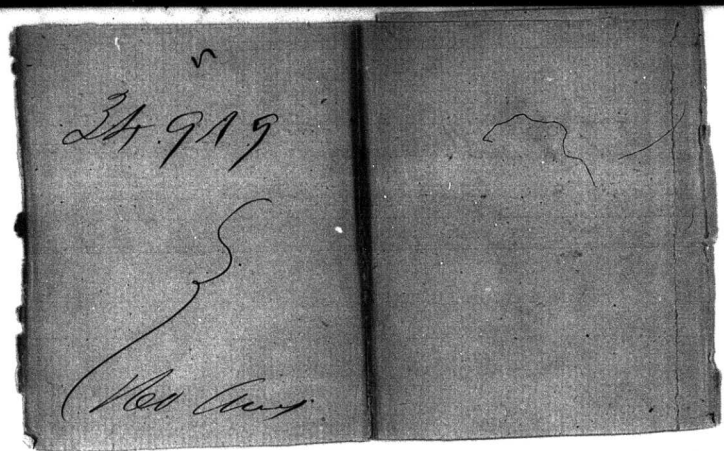

Department, (some Comptroller's office dated Sept. 29, 1835) in all cases where the pension has not been applied for for more than one year, no until evidence of the pensioner's identity has been transmitted to the Commissioner of Pensions, and a Special direction authorizing the payment has been given. These papers are now forwarded in order to obtain the Special direction required in order that the atty. may be able to obtain from the agent at Phila. the year pension designated in the power.
