Reference is made to your letter in which you request the record of Christian Lahman (Lehman?) whose widow, Resina, applied for penalton but her claim was rejected.

You are furnished herein the record of the only soldier named Christian Lahman, under any spelling, found in the Revolutionary War records of this office. The data therein were obtained from pension claim, R. 6084, based upon his service in that war.

The date and place of birth and names of the parents of Christian Lahman or Lehman are not shown.

Christian Lahman or Lehman married September 9, 1981, in York, Ponnsylvania, Rosina McClean. Their marriage was recorded in the German Reformed Church of York, Pennsylvania. He died in said Tork March 12, 1822.

Rosina Lehman or Lehman applied May 4, 1887, for pension which might have been due her as the widow of Christian Lahman or Lahman At that time she was aged eighty-two years and a resident of York County, Pennsylvania. Her name was borne on the pension records as Rosens Lahman, She signed by mark.

It was alleged that Christian Lahman or Lohman enlisted about November 1, 1781, at Tork, Pennsylvania, and that he served as a private under Major Bailey in the Pennsylvania troops at Camp Security in York County, Pennsylvania, and was engaged in guarding British prisoners taken with Cornwellis at his surrender, length of service two months; that he volunteered in the fall of 1782 and served two months as a private at the some place and under the some officers; that he volunteered in the spring of 1765, served two months under Ceptain Ford and was engaged in guarding British prisoners to Fredericktown. Maryland.

my hand and affixed the Seal of said Court at Cork Brough, this Tenth day of May, A.D. 1837.

Her claim for pension was not allowed as she feiled to furnish proof of six months' service as required by the pension law.

In 1837, one Daniel Lehman made affidavit in York County, Pennsylvania, in support of the claim for pension of soldierts midow, Rosina; his relationship to the family not shown. He signed Lehman.



Dear Medem:

Reference is made to your letter of February 18, in which you request the Revolutionary War record of Christian Lehman (Resims), of York County, Pennsylvania.

The data which follow were obtained from the papers on file in pension claim, R. 6064, based upon the Revolutionary War service of Christian Lahman or Lehman, the only soldier of that name found in the records of this office.

The date and place of soldier's birth and names of his parents are not shown.

Ohristian Lahman or Lehman married September 9, 1781, in York, Pennsylvania, Resima Mollean; their marriage was recorded in the German Reformed Church of said York, Pennsylvania.

He died March 12, 1822, in York, Pennsylvania.

On May 4, 1837, while living in York Goutty, Pennsylvania, Resina Lahman or Lehman, aged eighty-two years, applied for the pension that night have been due her as the widow of Christian Lahman or Lehman. Her name was borne on the pension records as Rosena Lahman. She signed by mark.

It was alleged that Christian Lahman or Lehman enlisted about November 1, 1781, at York, Pennsylvania, and that he served as a private under Major Bailey in the Pennsylvania troops at Camp Security in York County, Pennsylvania, and was engaged in guarding British prisoners taken with Cormeallis at his surrender, length of service two months; that he volunteered in the fall of 1783 and served two months as a private at the same place and under the same officers; that he volunteered in the spring

of 1783, served two months under Captain Ford and was engaged in guarding British prisoners to Fredericktown, Maryland.

Her claim was not allowed as she failed to furnish proof of six months' service as required by the pension law.

In 1837, one Daniel Lehman made affidevit in York County, Pennsylvania, in support of the claim for pension of soldier's widow, Rosina; relationship to the family not shown. He signed Lehman.

There are no further family data in the claim.
