On this 27th day of May A. D. 1837 Personally
appeared before me the Subscriber one of the Judges of the
Court of Common Pleas in and for said County, Rosina
Lahman a Resident of said County aged 82 years who
being by me duly sworn according to law doth in her Oath
make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit
of the provision made by the Act of Congress passed July 4th
1836

1st That ~~she~~ ^{she} ~~is~~ ^{was} the widow of Christian Lahman a Soldier of
the Revolutionary war that he was drafted about the 1st
of November 1781 at York for two months to guard watch
and keep secure the British prisoners taken with Genl
Cornwallis and duly served out ~~that~~ ^{under} ~~that~~ ^{the} ~~service~~
under Maj^r Bailey at camp security in the County of York
2^d That in the fall of the Year 1782 she volunteered to
serve at the same ^{place} at camp security in the County of
York for two months under Maj^r Bailey and duly
out the time for which he was drafted
3^d That in the Spring of the Year of 1783 she volunteered
to serve two months under Capt. Ford and marched
to Frederick town in Maryland with British prisoners
she remained in service two ^{months} on that Tour and that
he served at Least ~~two~~ ^{three} months in the Army of the
Revolution That she further declares that she was
married to her said Christian Lahman on the
9th day of September 1781 as well more fully appears
by the Announced marriage Certificate and that their
husband the said Christian Lahman died at York
on the 12th day of March A. D. 1822 and that she remained
a widow ever since that period as well more fully appears

Dear Sir:

Reference is made to your letter in which you request the record
of Christian Lahman (Lehman?) whose widow, Rosina, applied for pension
but her claim was rejected.

You are furnished herein the record of the only soldier named
Christian Lahman, under any spelling, found in the Revolutionary War
records of this office. The data therein were obtained from pension
claim, R. 6084, based upon his service in that war.

The date and place of birth and names of the parents of Christian
Lahman or Lehman are not shown.

Christian Lahman or Lehman married September 9, 1781, in York,
Pennsylvania, Rosina McClean. Their marriage was recorded in the
German Reformed Church of York, Pennsylvania. He died in said York
March 12, 1822.

Rosina Lahman or Lehman applied May 4, 1837, for pension which
might have been due her as the widow of Christian Lahman or Lehman.
At that time she was aged eighty-two years and a resident of York County,
Pennsylvania. Her name was borne on the pension records as Rosina
Lahman. She signed by mark.

It was alleged that Christian Lahman or Lehman enlisted about
November 1, 1781, at York, Pennsylvania, and that he served as a
private under Major Bailey in the Pennsylvania troops at Camp Security
in York County, Pennsylvania, and was engaged in guarding British
prisoners taken with Cornwallis at his surrender, length of service
two months; that he volunteered in the fall of 1782 and served two
months as a private at the same place and under the same officers; that
he volunteered in the spring of 1783, served two months under Captain
Fort and was engaged in guarding British prisoners to Fredericktown,
Maryland.

Her claim for pension was not allowed as she failed to furnish proof of six months' service as required by the pension law.

In 1887, one Daniel Lehman made affidavit in York County, Pennsylvania, in support of the claim for pension of soldier's widow, Rosina; his relationship to the family not shown. He signed Lehman.

There are no further family data in the claim.

Dear Madam:

Reference is made to your letter of February 18, in which you request the Revolutionary War record of Christian Lehman (Rosina), of York County, Pennsylvania.

The data which follow were obtained from the papers on file in pension claim, R. 6084, based upon the Revolutionary War service of Christian Lehman or Lehman, the only soldier of that name found in the records of this office.

The date and place of soldier's birth and names of his parents are not shown.

Christian Lehman or Lehman married September 9, 1781, in York, Pennsylvania, Rosina McGlean; their marriage was recorded in the German Reformed Church of said York, Pennsylvania.

He died March 12, 1822, in York, Pennsylvania.

On May 4, 1837, while living in York County, Pennsylvania, Rosina Lehman or Lehman, aged eighty-two years, applied for the pension that might have been due her as the widow of Christian Lehman or Lehman. Her name was borne on the pension records as Rosena Lehman. She signed by mark.

It was alleged that Christian Lehman or Lehman enlisted about November 1, 1781, at York, Pennsylvania, and that he served as a private under Major Bailey in the Pennsylvania troops at Camp Security in York County, Pennsylvania, and was engaged in guarding British prisoners taken with Cornwallis at his surrender, length of service two months; that he volunteered in the fall of 1782 and served two months as a private at the same place and under the same officers; that he volunteered in the spring

examined. ~~as filed with the
papers in this office.~~
It is alleged that her husband ^{then owned} pur-
chased three tons of ^{iron} ~~iron~~ and
militia men of Pennsylvania ~~the last~~
in guarding British prisoners, the last
ton being in the spring of 1783. ~~There~~
was no such service as alleged so
late as the spring of 1783, for a period of
two months ~~the~~. The 5th section
of the act of 4 July 1786 provides for
none whose husbands, did not
serve six months. The claim has there-
fore been rejected and the papers filed
with rejected cases in this office.
