(being a court of Pleas) weaver, upon oath makes
the following declaration:

That said declarant in the year one thousand seven hundred
and seventy six enlisted with Lieut. Caldwell, and served as a
Marine under the command of Capt. Mosson of the Marine Corps
in the ship Montgomery of the Port of Phila. Capt. Ferris
Commander for the term of one year; that after the expiration
of said service the said declarant served a term of two
months military duty at Lancaster, in the State of Penna.
guarding the British prisoners taken at the surrender of
Genl. Burgoyne.

That on the expiration of the service above
mentioned, this declarant received from his several
Commanders written certificates of his discharge, and that
he has lost the same by time and accident.

That the declarant is more than sixty one years
of age, infirm, and from his reduced circumstances in life is
now in need of assistance from his country for support; and that
he hereby relinquishes his claim to every pension heretofore allowed
him by the laws of the United States. Andrew Pagan
