 for that purpose - You will please to hire the waggon
 on the best terms ^{you can} and draw on the Council for the expense
 and the same shall be paid to your order.

 it is necessary ~~they~~ should be forwarded ^{also} to the ~~head~~
 of Elk, and ^{he} requests a guard of militia for that purpose
~~which~~ you will please to furnish him with, such guard
~~of~~ ~~as~~ he may direct and be attentive to the
 appointment of ~~an~~ ^{an} officer to this ^{day} who may safely be
 relied on.
