State of Pennsylvania
County of York

On the 7th day of January A.D. 1833 Personally
Appeared before me the subscriber one of the Judges of the Court
of Common Pleas in and for the said County of York in the State
of Pennsylvania John Stark aged 75 years who being just duly
Sworn according to law in Oath to obtain the Benefit of an Act of
Congress passed June 7, 1832

1. That about the 1st of November 1781 I volunteered to serve
in Captain Foden's Company as a Substitute for Jacob
Hathcock for two months at Camp Security in York County
to guard watch & keep secure the prisoners taken with Genl Cornwallis
and duly served out the time for which I engaged and was then discharged
by Capt. Foden at Camp Security in the County of York.

2. And that he was drafted about the middle of the month of April 1782
to serve in Captain Hedges Company for two months to serve at
Camp security to guard the Prisoners and served two months
and was honorably discharged a Camp Security of
County by Capt. Col. Hedges on Jan 1782

3. That he volunteered to serve in Captain Foden's
Company to guard the British prisoners
taken with Genl Cornwallis in the year 1782
and served two months the time he volunteered
and was honorably discharged at Camp security
in the month of November 1782
recently increased by Capt. Col. Hedges and that he served
at least altogether six months in the Army of the
Revolution and that he has no documentary evidence
of his service in his possession nor does he know of any
person living that is capable to prove his service except
Mathias Diby when he relinquish every claim to
a pension except the present and declare that my name
is not on the pension Roll of the Agency of any State or place
whatever nor did ever apply for a pension or annuity before

I was a Substitute Drafted the First time was
the Col. Rottkot for a Jacob Rothrock a Soldier
for two months the Second time was
the Third time I was also draft and
Served at York six months altogether the
Army of the Revolution

Question by Judge 5 State the names of some of the Regular Officers

Continental and Militia Regiments

Since I was not acquainted with many regular Officers
they were all other Officers mostly that guard the British prisoners taken with General Lee

John Staab an applicant for a pension and that he
the said John Staab did serve in Captain Copehangers
Company and Capt Satherly's Company and Capt Ward's
Company as he states in his declaration and that
he served altogether six months or more in the army
of the Revolution Defendant served the same
time in the same manner as with the said John
Staab and facts from his own knowledge
