I must beg leave to trouble you in
requesting your aid in behalf of an aged Lady in this
City - Charlotte Haren the Widow of General Haren of the
Revolutionary Army. was allowed a pension of two hundred
Dollars a Year and accrued it some annuities for several
Years past. She is now informed that it will be necessary for
her to obtain a Certificate from the Secretary at War to
enable her to have this sum paid to her at the office at
New York. where she has heretofore received it. permit me Sir
to Intrust the favour of you to obtain this paper on her behalf
and forward it by my friend John W. Taylor who will deliver
it to me. I am with Great Respect

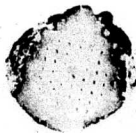

Sir:

In answer to your enquiry whether
Mrs Charlotte Hagen dec^d left any Heir or
Heirs, I have to observe that I was personally
acquainted with her, & never heard or under-
stood that she had any; on the contrary I
believe she had none. I permit me to re-
mark that Charles D. Cooper claims to
be paid the balance due on his pension,
as Executor of the late Lieut. Governor
Fayler, who was the Assignee of that pension
for valuable consideration, & on an ac-
quinty granted by him to Mrs Hagen.
I have believed that as such Assignee
his title was paramount to the claims
of Mrs Hagen's representatives, had she
left any; & that the papers I delivered
to you would be an ample authority &
protection to the government against any
other possible claim.
