On this 20 day of June 1834 Personally appears in open Court in the Orphans Court of the County of York and for the County of York and State of Pennsylvania now sitting at York in the State of Pennsylvania a resident of said County aged 81 year who being first duly sworn according to Law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of an Act of Congress passed June 7th 1832

1 That he was drafted in Captain Oliver Company in Lancaster County about the 1st July in the year 1776 in Col Crisbbs Regt and marched from Lancaster to Philadelphia from thence to Trenton on the State of New Jersey and to Princeton and from thence to Camden and from thence to Abingdon and from thence to Red Bank and was there when Long Island was taken and gave the battle but was not in the engagement himself and that he duly served out the time for which he was drafted to Nov 2 months

2 That ~~in~~ then and there in the State of Massachusetts immediately after he was discharged from this first Tour Enlisted for six months and was attached to the flying Camp and crossed the Hudson river immediately after the battle of Long Island and marched under Captain Ch. Gower under whom he had Enlisted and marched to a place called Hurlgate up the east River from New York and was in a battle at that place from thence he marched to the Hudson river above New York and crossed the river into the State of New Jersey and marched to a place called Springfield in the State of New Jersey and from thence marched to Trenton and took the Hopewell at that place and marched with them to Philadelphia and was honorably discharged at Phila and duly served six months the time for which he Enlisted That in the same month of the same year he volunteered to serve as a Substitute for soldier named John Brown in Captain Miley's Company and marched to the Allegheney Mountain and served two months and was honorably discharged by Capt Miley & continued

That I have by a long and very laborious search to a person or persons that he served at least altogether ten months in the Army of the Revolution and that I have no Documentary evidence in my possession nor do I know any person now living whose testimony I can procure to prove my service clearly & unequivocally to a person, annually and solemnly and declare my name next on the Pension roll of the agency of any State or place

Answer I was born in Lancaster County in the year 1753

Answer I have a record of my age in my paper book

Question by the Court 3 Where were you living when called into service and where do you now live?

Answer I lived in Lancaster County when called into service and have lived in Lancaster and York County ever since the Revolution

Question by the Court 4 How were you called into service were you drafted did you volunteer or were you a substitute and if a substitute for whom?

Answer I was drafted the first time and marched to N. Jersey and duly served out the term and then enlisted for six months in the flying Camps and duly served out the term after which I went to a substitute and served as a substitute for John Weaver

Question by the Court 5 State the names of some of the regular Officers who were with the troops when you served with Continental and militia Regiments as you commanded and the general circumstances of your service

Answer I do not recollect the names of any of the Regular Officers at present do I recollect the names of the militia Officers except them, under whom I served

Question by the Court 6 Did you ever receive a discharge from the Service and if so what has become of it and by whom was it given?

Answer I received several discharges from the Service by the Officers under whom I served all of which I have lost

Dear Sir:

Reference is made to your letter in which you request the record of Casper Zagar, of York County, Pennsylvania, who received pension on account of his service in the Revolutionary War.

The data which follow were obtained from the papers on file in Revolutionary War pension claim, S.8002, based upon the military service in that war of Casper Zagar.

Casper Zagar was born in 1753, in Lancaster County, Pennsylvania. The names of his parents are not shown.

While residing in said Lancaster County, Casper Zagar enlisted about July, 1776, served as a private in Captain Old's Company, Colonel Grubb's Pennsylvania Regiment, marched through New Jersey to Paulus Hook, and was in sight of the battle of Long Island but did not participate in that engagement; length of service, two months; he immediately reenlisted, served in Captain McGowan's Pennsylvania Company in the Flying Camp, marched to Burlington on East River (probably meant New York City) and was in an engagement at that place, then marched to Trenton and was at the taking of the Hessians, after which he marched to Philadelphia and was discharged; length of service, six months; he reenlisted in same month and served two months in Captain Miller's Pennsylvania Company. *did not find records in Pa*
Col of mil in Helton's
also 2 capt's named Old, of Pa & a Capt McGowan
did not find Capt Miller but there may Miller's records

He was allowed pension on his application executed May 20, 1834, while living in York County, Pennsylvania.

There are no data as to the family of Casper Zagar.

Madam:

In response to your personal request of the 23rd instant, you are advised that Casper Zegar, Sur. File No. 8,002, Rev. War, was allowed pension on his application executed May 20, 1834, at which time he was a resident of York County, Pennsylvania.

He stated that he was born in 1753, in Lancaster County, Pennsylvania, where he resided when he was drafted July 1, 1776, and served in Captain Olds's company, Colonel Grubbs regiment; two months.

Enlisted in New Jersey immediately after above service, under Captain McGowan in the "Flying Camp." was in an engagement at Hell Gate up the East River, marched to Trenton and took the Hessians at that place, served six months and was discharged at Philadelphia, and then volunteered in Captain Wiley's company, and served two months.

There are no other dates given, and no family data on file.

For the date of last payment of soldier's pension, to whom paid, application should be made to the Auditor for
