The State of Ohio, Robert Cairns of said Co  
Cark County, November 7<sup>th</sup> 1853.

Personally appeared in  
open Court Sarah Faulkner of said  
County aged fifty nine years the twenty fifth  
day of October last who being first duly  
sworn solemnly on her oath made the follow-  
ing declaration in order to obtain the  
benefit of the provisions made by the act  
of Congress passed July 7<sup>th</sup> 1838, July 4<sup>th</sup> 1836  
and the act of Congress passed in 1828 and other  
acts of Congress allowing Pensioners to Revolu-  
tionary Soldiers their Widows & Orphans -  
That she is a child and heir at Law of  
Jacob Ludwisch a Revolutionary Soldier for  
the State of Pennsylvania. That said Jacob  
Ludwisch enlisted in the Army of the United  
States from the County of Chester a County of York,  
<sup>in the State of Pennsylvania</sup>  
about the commencement of said War with Great  
Britain and enlisted for and served during  
said Revolutionary War as she understands  
from her said father when he was living, and  
from sundry other informants she believes the same.  
She has heard her father say he was in the Battle  
of Brandy Hill, "Battle of Brandywine and  
others. She has heard her father that the names of  
some of the officers under whom he served but  
she cannot recollect their names. She does not  
know whether he had a discharge but she thinks  
he had & the said Court. She further states that  
her said father was married to Mary Huddle  
of Pennsylvania before he went into the War  
as she understands from her Parents & believes that the  
Record acts she cannot state

Said Jacob Ludwisch had children  
Elizabeth. Who entered and with Henry Miller  
~~and~~ four children then of War and living in  
Pennsylvania the said Elizabeth is dead.  
George Ludwisch now living - Philadelphia  
Pennsylvania, Thine Mary who died  
without issue, Sarah Phoebe now living  
near Philadelphia. Fifth Catharine  
now living intermarried with John Frank  
near Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Sixth  
Margaret deceased lady and child -  
Seventh Sarah intermarried with  
Thomas Falkner but who is now dead  
The said Sarah now living and the  
above mentioned other children & Heirs of  
said Jacob, John & Thomas all living in Chester  
County Pennsylvania next to John who  
lives in the State of Indiana.  
I should further state that her said father  
died intestate in Chester County Pennsylvania  
about the 8<sup>th</sup> day of May 1838 and leaving said  
Mary Ludwisch his widow who carried  
his widow up to the year 1836 said widow in  
May of that year when she died the said Jacob  
& said Mary had four children and mother  
but left the said deceased children then living  
at said Jacob's only children - I should further  
on behalf of her self and other children of the  
Representatives for whatever is due & owing  
to them - She does not know of any Dutch  
warrants issued within the State or  
Department of Washington to establish  
said claim - and she swears to the same for  
truth that
