me the undersigned

Resident Judge of the Court of Common
Pleas for the south circuit in the State
of Ohio Patrick Sullivan of Hamilton
County in the State aforesaid, who being
duly sworn according to law deposed
and saith, that on or about the 24th day
of June 1775, he with about fifty others
enlisted, (or as he considered it at that
time entered as a volunteer) at Githys
Govern in York County State of Pennsyl-
=vania under Capt. Mc Dougal of Col.
Thompson's Regiment, of Replemen
(called the first Pennsylvania Rifle Regt.)
That on or about the first day of July
1775, he marched with the company
aforesaid for Boston, from the
town of York (Pennsylvania) that he
served three years and sixteen days
or thereabout in this Regt. and was
discharged from it at White Plains
in the year, 1778, at the time of his
discharge the company to which he
belonged was commanded by Capt.
Chambers and the Regiment by Col.
Chambers and this deponent further
deposeth and saith, that on his
way home at Reading in the
State of Pennsylvania he enlisted
to serve during the then existing
war between Great Britain & the
United Colonies, under Capt. John
Cobey in the 2nd Pennsylvania Regi-
ment, commanded by Colonel
Matter ~~of~~ ^{of} and that he served

in this Regiment until he was discharged
at Philadelphia some time in the year
1783, and that his discharge was signed
by Capt John Doyle who commanded
the Company and countersigned
as he believes by Colonel Stewart.
That he left this discharge in Pennsylvania
when he joined Genl Maysers Army
in the Western Country under whose
Command he served three years
or there about, And this deponent
further deposes and saith that
from his advanced age and infir-
mities being now in his 79th year
he stands in need of the assistance
of his Country for support and
further saith not
