That she is widow of George Kochs late of the township, and County aforesaid who was a soldier during the war, and for his services was in the receipt of pension from the United States that her maiden name was Catherine Schlegel - that she was lawfully married to said Kochs sometime during the year 1785 about the month of March to the best of her recollection by the Rev Mr Schaeffer at Hanover in said County; that her husband the aforesaid George Kochs died in or about the month of May 1792 that she was not married to him prior to his leaving the service, but the marriage took place before the year 1794 about the time above stated that she has not married since the death of said Kochs but, certainly, his widow still, that from family infirmity she is unable to attend Court to make her declaration, that she can furnish no other evidence of her marriage of a written character than the accompanying copy of an old book upon which there appears a family record of birth.

On the 12th day of December A.D. 1832 Before
me one of the judges of the court of common pleas in and
for said county, personally appears George Krebs a resident
of the Township of Codorus and county of York and State of
Pennsylvania, aged seventy eight years and upwards, being
first duly sworn according to law, doth on his solemn oath
make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit
of the act of Congress passed June 7th 1832 that he entered
the service of the United States under the following named offi-
cers and served as herein after stated, That on or before the
~~entire~~ day of July 1776 then thirty two years of age at the
Borough of York, being drafted, I entered a Militia company
commanded by Captain John McCannell, we marched
through the counties of Lancaster and Chester to the city of
Philadelphia, through the State of New Jersey, to the town of
Newark where I enlisted for six months in the Flying Camp
the circumstance of the sixth man of McCannells company
being transferred to the company commanded by Captain
John Ewing of which I was one we then proceeded to Fort
Lee the whole under command of General Ewing, Col. Simpe
and Major Bailey, I remained at Fort Lee during the
engagement and defeat of Fort Washington on the 16th
day of November 1776 after which we vacated Fort Lee
and retreated to Hackensack from thence to Trenton
from thence crossed the Delaware, ~~we~~ remained
and were on or after the tenth day of January 1777
I was discharged and soon after returned to my native
county of York - In the Year 1777 I served two
months as substitute for John Houlder, in the militia
in Guarding Camp Security, guarding the prisoners
which were within six miles of the Borough of York
the whole were under the command of Captain Dotts
In the Year 1778 I was drafted and served in
the militia two months under Captain Gellinicks and

One Col. Philip Abbott, in an expedition
against the Indians - I never received any written
or printed discharge, I was born in the county of York
in the year 1754 the only record of my age is my Baptism
in the Church records, from a State of Bodily infirmities
I am unable to attend in open court, We have a place
of public worship in our Township in our Township, our
pastor the Rev'd Mr. Melchiorius died about two years
since, the present officiating clergy & a young man
 lately emigrated from North Carolina, does not reside
in the Township and great distance from the Church
has but little knowledge of my character and distance
to great to procure his services in my case
I do hereby relinquish every claim what ever to a
pension or annuity except the present and declare
that my name is not on any pension roll of any State
excepting an annuity of Forty Dollars by virtue

Dear Madame

Reference is made to your letters in which you request the Revolutionary War records of Samuel Gragg, of Greene County, Tennessee, and George Krebs, of York County, Pennsylvania, who received pension in 1833.

Because of the great demand for Revolutionary War data and the limited trained clerical force available for furnishing such information, it is impossible to comply in full with each request pertaining to soldiers of that war. You are furnished herein the record of George Krebs or Kreps, the dates for which were obtained from the papers filed in Revolutionary War pension claim, W.3094, based upon his military service in that war.

George Krebs was born May 6, 1784, in York County, Pennsylvania. The names of his parents are not shown.

While residing in said York County, George Krebs enlisted about July 10, 1776, served in Captain John McMillin's and John Birney's Companies, Colonel Grose's Pennsylvania Regiment of the Flying Camp, marched to Fort Lee, was there when Fort Washington fell; he marched on the retreat through New Jersey, crossed the Delaware into Pennsylvania and was discharged January 10, 1777; in 1777, he served two months under Captain Dotin, at Camp Sourire, near York, engaged in guarding prisoners held at that place; in 1778, he served two months in Captain Sullivan's Company, Colonel Philip Albright's Pennsylvania Regiment and went on a campaign against the Indians.

He was allowed pension on his application executed December 12, 1832, while a resident of Cedars Township, York County, Pennsylvania. He signed Krebs, was borne on the pension rolls as Krebs. He also received an annuity of \$40.00 from the state of Pennsylvania.

George Krebs died May 7, 1842, in Cedars Township, Pennsylvania.

The soldier married in March, 1785, Catharine Wherely, born January 10, 1785, place of birth and names of parents not shown. They were married in Hanover, York County, Pennsylvania, by the Reverend Mr. Schrader.

Soldier's widow, Catharine, was allowed pension on her application executed June 16, 1843, while residing in Cedars Township, York County, Pennsylvania.

In 1843, son Johannes Krebs lived in York County, Pennsylvania.

In 1843, one Elizabeth Krebs, was aged eighty-three years and resided in York County, Pennsylvania, her relationship to the family not stated.
