Memorandum for the Council of Purvices

(True) John Edie was a Lt of the 6th Pa Regt afterwards
 numbered then 14th. In the roll of that Regt for 1791
 I think August 1791 - at all events it is the last roll of said
 Regt prior to the general Disbandment of the Continental Army
 from 88 to Seventy Regts which took place at White Plains Nov-
 York on 16th Sept 1783. John Edie will be found as a Lieut
 with the remark "Discharge of war on parole left out in the
 new arrangement". This roll is in a book the Vol or 40
 not now attached it is however with the County of Lancaster
 since and if I mistake not is 40 of the same of the Vice
 - given here. Read again in Vol 105 will be found a list of
 Officers of the County of Lancaster since under the new
 Arrangement and also a list of the supernumeraries
 of the several Regts in which will be found the name of
 John Edie with a succession of others of said Regt who are
 the roll of the Regt first referred to will be found the same
 remark of "Discharge of war on parole left out in the new
 arrangement" and of these officers thus noted it will be found
 that Abdiel M. Collier and Warrant 1782 and Samuel M. Sherman
 and Warrant 1789 each for 200 acres by the Secretary then &
 that supernumeraries were come and at all times entitled to
 Bounty land - Will you see cause this claim to be taken
 up and proved as early as practicable

Know all men by these presents that we Philip Southhoff and
 Sarah his wife of the City of Baltimore do hereby constitute and ap-
 point Henry Chase of Washington City our true and lawful attorney
 with power of substitution for us and in our names to prepare papers
 and collect proofs and vouchers to enable us and our heirs John R
 Edie of Sumner & County Prince Georges to obtain a warrant from the
 United States for two hundred acres of land in right of the
 services of our late grandfather John Edie as a Lieutenant in the
 Prince Georges Regt of the Army of the Revolution and to present the
 same before the secretary of War of the United States and if allowed
 to ask demand and receive of him a warrant for the said two hun-
 dred acres but for nothing more than two hundred acres of land
 and to separate the same with the balance of the general land of-
 fice for said Irish and to ask demand receive and receipt for the
 same and to endorse of right transfer and make sale of the same
 and to do and perform all manner of things touching the same
 which we might do ourselves were we personally present in witness
 of which we have set our hands and seals this sixth ^{day of}
 October 1845 Philip Southhoff
